“We didn't do any fundraising, everyone basically said let's do it, we're going. We weren't missing out on this chance, especially with the last couple of years being ruled by COVID-19.” Those are the words of Tori Worboys coach of the U15 Boys Orange Representative team who are enjoying their 2022 McDonald's Kanga Cup adventure.

The team are from a little country town called Orange, in the Central West region, is a Representative team made up of a collective of Clubs in the town and features players from

Barnstoneworth United FC, Cyms FC and Waratahs FC. The collective have reportedly developed into exceptional players, with lots of potential and are keen to show what they can do.

“Lots of siblings around us has raved about how much fun and different Kanga Cup is,” Worboys said of why the team made the trip to Canberra. “Our coach has always wanted to take an exceptional team to Kanga, and this year we truly have an exceptional team. I wanted the boys to have every chance at experiencing different levels and quality of football, and they deserve to be part of something so incredible as Kanga Cup.

“We're going to enjoy our time, that's for sure. We'll probably spend a fair bit of time watching other games. There are lots of options and activities for us to do/see in Canberra, we'll be taking advantage of that. Might depend on how tired the boys are after their games!”

The McDonald's Kanga Cup has a unique stranglehold on teams, many of whom travel many hours to be part of the competition, in the main to test themselves against the best that the country has to offer at their age level and, in some instances, get the chance to play against teams from overseas.

“It's the biggest youth comp in our country and the potential to play international teams is an unreal feeling,” Worboys commented. “We have friends and family that have played in Kanga Cup previously and they can't express enough how much fun they had and how they wish they could still participate.

“Kanga Cup opens so many doors for everyone involved, the players, coaches, and refs. It’s the one event every football player/coach/manager should get to experience. It’s not just the quality of football that will be around us and that we will be playing, but everything that comes with an event like this.

“The travelling with a team, the bonding, making new friends and connections, the chance to meet incredible people in all aspects of football and to appreciate that everyone at Kanga Cup has something in common, that thousands of people from all corners love football just as much as us.”

Whilst they had no fundraising per se, the sheer pull of the tournament was enough to secure their registration, the Orange District Football Association had their part to play in sending the representative outfit, and there were many others who have made this trip possible as Worboys attests.

“The biggest thank you goes to the boy’s parents,” she said. “They are all so supportive and just want the best opportunities for them. Honestly would be a very different environment for us if we didn’t have them. A special shout out to Jen for all her organisation, time, and effort she put in to get us here, we’d probably be sleeping in our cars if she hadn’t. Thank you also to our Manager Jacinta, for keeping us on time, making sure we’re all registered and has about five back plans to our back plan, so we’re prepared for anything!”

“We have had some great success at the tournament before and are hoping for the same in 2022. As well as the players getting something out of this week, we also hope to see our coaches develop and manage the hurdles thrown at them whilst managing a team for the full week.

“The McDonalds Kanga Cup has created a name for it and set a standard which is why teams keep coming back. I think the biggest draw card is that teams can head away and act like a professional team in a professional environment for a week tournament. This year is even better I believe leading into the Men’s and Women’s World Cups.”

There is more to the event than just football of course and the Wagga group, including parents and officials, are excited about the chance to act like a fully fledged full-time football club for the duration of the competition, a unique experience for the youngsters involved.

“Being away as a team and a club is an awesome experience and will allow for teams to go for team dinners or even hit the pool up for a recovery session and act like a professional team for the week,” Dedini said.

“If we have access to the VEO Cameras we will try and do some video sessions for the younger teams to give them that experience and the chance to watch their games back for enjoyment and as a learning experience. We will also take this time to have coaches’ meetings to work as a team and develop our coaches also.

“For the last two years, every Thursday night at training, we have opened up the canteen to cover a lot of the cost,” Poh revealed. “Our famous ‘Cevapi nights’ have been very popular and a good source of additional funding to help our teams get to Canberra.
